Incentives for Energy Efficient Lighting Measures (Effective February 1, 2009)

2 or 3-Foot and U Shape Fluorescent Fixtures, T12 to T8 and Electronic Ballast	
One or more lamps	\$ 10
4-Foot Fluorescent Fixture, T12 to T8 and Electronic Ballast (Must meet high-performance T8 specifications; see definitions on page 2)	
One-lamp	\$ 15
Two-, three- or four-lamp	\$ 20
Delamping (Per 4-foot lamp removed)	\$ 5
6 or 8-Foot Fluorescent Fixture, T12 To T8 (800 Series) and Electronic Ballast

Additional Information about Available Incentives

- Listed incentives are effective February 1, 2009.
- Incentives listed on this form are for lighting projects on existing buildings only, not new construction.
- Incentives listed on this form are available for common area lighting projects only. Lighting retrofits within individual units do not qualify for incentives.
- Lighting projects are eligible for incentives regardless of simple payback (without incentives) or burn times.
- The minimum total lighting measure incentive is \$100 per project.
- Retrofit lighting projects must provide at least 25% energy savings compared to the existing system.
- Custom incentives of up to 35% of the cost of eligible installed lighting measures are available.
- The Multifamily lighting program and incentives are identical to the Business Efficiency lighting program and incentives with two major exceptions: the inspection requirement and the lack of a simple payback requirement.

The Application Process

1. All projects require pre-approval. Please contact Multifamily Home Energy Solutions staff at 1-866-311-1822 to apply for Energy Trust incentives and the Oregon Business Energy Tax Credit.
2. All properties must have a final inspection by Multifamily program staff. Inspections are typically conducted when the project is 70% complete. Multifamily staff will contact you to schedule the inspection.

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
