



How to apply for project development assistance for your small wind project:

Depending on your project's complexity, your contractor may need to perform a detailed wind resource or site assessment, or you may need to get expert assistance for grant writing. Energy Trust may provide up to 50% of the cost of hiring a consultant to provide expert assistance for these activities, up to the maximum funding levels listed below. Your contractor will help you complete and submit your development assistance forms.

Proposed Project Size Maximum Project Development Incentive Amount

<= 4 kW	\$2,000
> 4 kW and <= 20 kW	\$5,000
> 20 kW and <= 100 kW	\$10,000

Generally, your contractor can perform the necessary work, but Energy Trust can also help you identify experts with experience in the area where you need assistance.

1. To apply for this kind of assistance from Energy Trust, complete and submit the following forms:
 - o Energy Trust Project Enrollment Application (Form 910E – PDF | Doc). This form provides Energy Trust with information about your project.
 - o Request for Funding (Form 930RF – PDF | Doc). This form tells Energy Trust what kind of development assistance you need, how much it will cost and how much time will be needed for the work.
 - o Substitute W-9 (PDF)
2. If the application is approved, you will receive a "Project Enrollment Approval Notice" and a copy of the approved funding request from Energy Trust.
3. Work with your selected consultant to complete the pre-approved work by its deadline.
4. After the work is completed, submit a Completion Certification (Form 940C – PDF| Doc) along with proof that the work was completed and the consultant was paid in full. Once this form is received, Energy Trust can reimburse you for half of the cost of the assistance up to the limits listed above.
